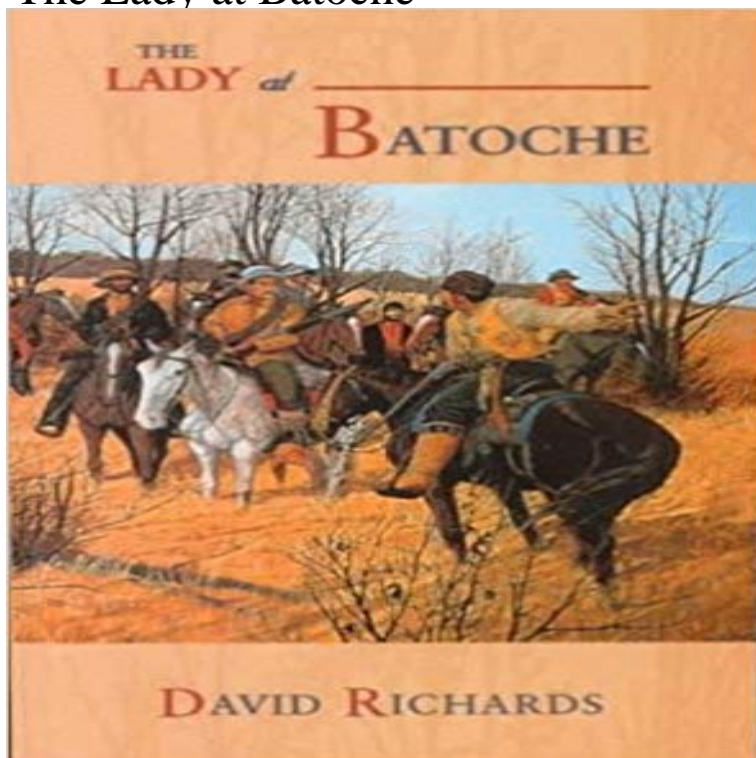


The Lady at Batoche
