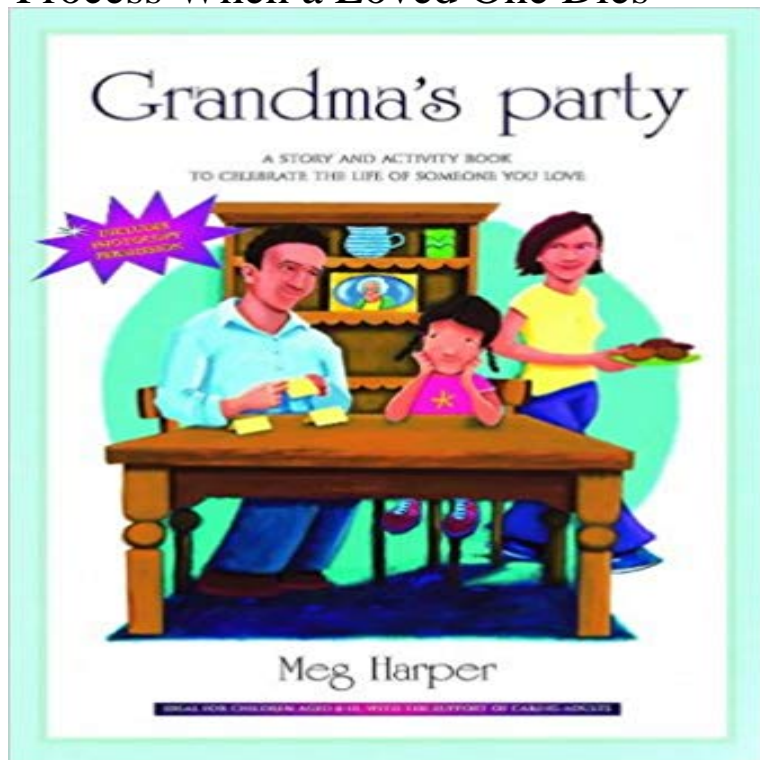


Grandmas Party: Practical Ways to Help Children be Part of the Grieving Process When a Loved One Dies
