Our confident, high-energy, aggressive, free-flowing, and fluid style made us winners. When Jorge Sampaoli became coach, he did things "the Bielsa way." And we kept on winning. After 99 years of losing, Chile, playing beautifully, finally won her first championship. We are champions, now, always, and forever...
