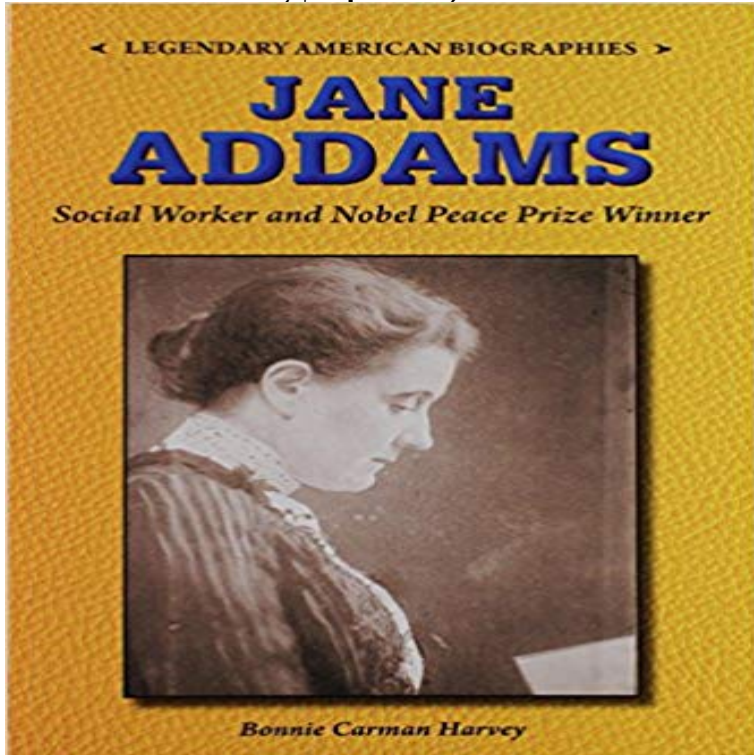


Jane Addams: Social Worker and Nobel Peace Prize Winner (Legendary American Biographies)
