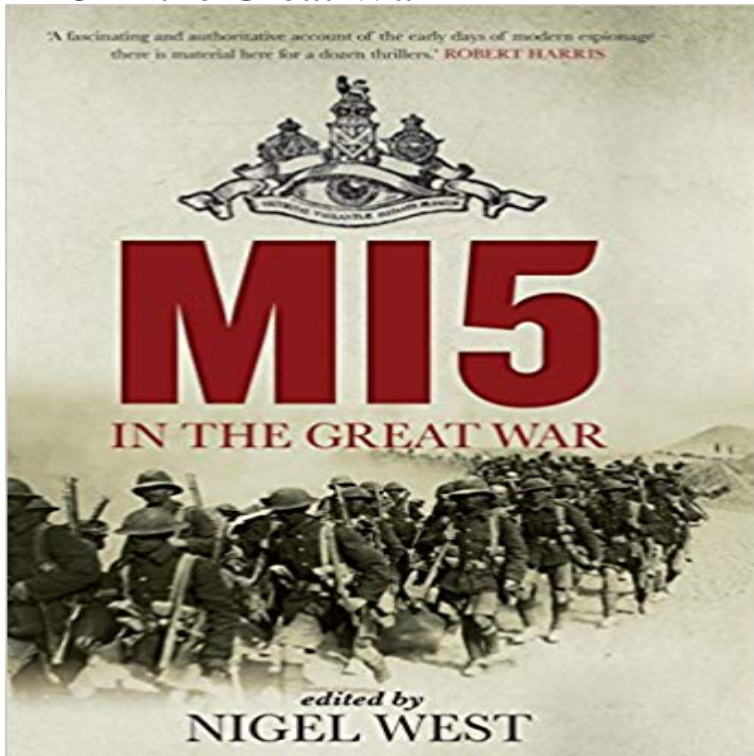


MI5 in the Great War

The main narrative examines MI5s various attempts to both manage and detect double agents; the detection and execution of enemy spies; its study of German pre-war espionage; and the Kaisers personal network of spies seeking to infiltrate British intelligence.
