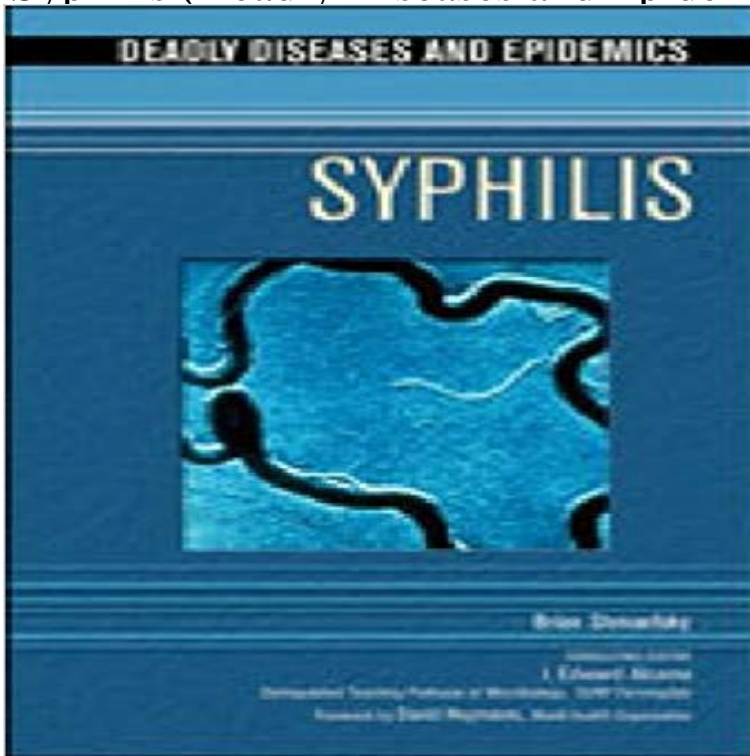


Syphilis (Deadly Diseases and Epidemics)
